The Freemasonry Brothers gathered in Montesilvano (Pescara - Italy) in an International Meeting to celebrate the 300 years of F.'.M.'. , they express the joint and shared will to continue the Masonic tradition of the Ancient Fathers who, having come into contact with the Ancient Wisdom, patrimony of distant lands and civilizations, they cultivated the highest ideals of peace, solidarity and brotherhood, becoming custodians and defenders of the circulation of free thought to glorify the High Creator.

It is a joint and shared will of the present Founding Fathers of the present Constitutive Charter to favor the free expression of religious thought, allowing everyone to address their prayer to the God of the Universe, the One Lord for every Man.

It was considered, after careful analysis, that it is the mission of civilization for every Muratory Obedience to have a cultural and moral impact on the social read, respecting its identity, tradition and professed values.

We intend to affirm, at the sunrise of the third millennium, the principle of equal dignity to men and women of good will, welcoming all those who want to witness immutable and eternal values as brothers and sisters belonging to Freemasonry, abandoning definitively obsolete conventions, social prejudices and discrimination concerning sex, rituals and the unilateral discipline of the recognition of regularity.

Therefore, every Obedience, in memory of the ideals pursued by the Ancient Masters, proposes to pass on and disseminate these values for the complete formation of the people and particularly, of the future, young generations, to contribute to the moral progress of today's way human and civil.

In this perspective, the establishment of a Statute for the foundation of the A.U.M. was evaluated in an absolutely necessary manner, to pursue, together, the same social commitment in favor of the community, especially to protect the weak and the human suffering, by voting for the cause of peace and brotherhood, regardless of any prejudice, in the name of the highest ethical and moral principles, Heritage of all humanity.

In light of the shared and express considerations, therefore it is signed, by the Masonic Obediences and Communions referred to in Article 1), the Statute that follow.

STATUTES A.U.M.

ART.1

which, jointly, intend to defend, in a spirit of genuine brotherhood, the preservation and promotion of inner self-knowledge, fighting intolerance and helping to rediscover the spirit of solidarity, favouring and encouraging mutual aid as a sign of equality between human beings, children of one God and working for peace, considering it as an element of harmony between persons and peoples, essential for their development in freedom.

Each Obedience, sovereign in its own identity, reciprocally recognizing the Ranks of the respective

Dignitaries, Brothers and Sisters who adorn the Columns of the Temples of Confederate Obediences, proposes, together with Them, to promote on the territory the defense, care and protection the human suffering and of the weak, within the limits of their possibilities, through the specific activities envisaged by the respective Statutes, working also with synergy for the moral and social progress of the community.

The Organisms participants and fraternized by the following Protocol, undertake to promote, according to a joint calendar of events, training and research activities, also through publications, aimed at deepening themes and cultural campaigns of general interest.

ART. 2

For the definition, the elaboration and the realization of projects and joint and shared interventions, the confederate Obediences, signatory and twinned in the A.U.M., they will make use of the specific logistic-administrative structures.

ART. 3

For the foregoing, followed of the intentions stated, the Confederate Obedience, through the respective legal Representatives, agree to enter into the following Protocol of Understanding. Through this act the Constituent Members, to any title and qualification included in the respective Organisms, recognize themselves united by the bond of solidarity, to promote and jointly support every form of collaboration, mutual aid, brotherhood and support among themselves and in favor of the community, in order to follow common roads towards ever higher and more significant socio-cultural and spiritual goals.

ART. 4

By virtue of the honor commitment to mutual recognition, mutual aid, to the Fraternity according to the eternal immutable and universal values, professed by Freemasonry, unanimously assumed at the International Convention of Montesilvano (Pescara-Italy) on 24.25 March 26, 2017, today's Fathers Founders, of the present Universal Masonic Alliance, consider useful necessary and fruitful, the preparation of this Confederation Statute, to preserve, together, the traditions of the Ancient Values, codify the performance and behavior of the M. Brothers, according to the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Ritual and the Ancient Rule, and finally handing down their testimony to future generations.

ART. 5

Hereby the Masonic Universal Alliance is therefore constituted. The Organization is a Confederation.

By right participates in this Constituent Assembly, the Sovereigns G. C., the Grand Masters of twinned Obedience, and already participants to the commitment assumed in Montesilvano (Pescara – Italy) and, by co-optation, the GC and Grand Masters and Dignitaries indicated by them Obedience that they intend to confederate.

Each Representative or Delegate of each Obedience will have its seat in the constituted Parliament of the A.U.M. and will have the right to vote in resolutions of a general interest nature..

In the first session the President of the A.U.M. will be elected, he will remain in office for four years.

For the election as President, candidates must reach two thirds of those entitled to vote.

A simple majority is required in any subsequent voting.

The President will make use of two Vice Presidents and an Executive Council, elected with the same criteria, composed of eight members (from each continent) who will assist him in the operational choices aimed at the Alliance's good.

They will meet in an Ordinary Chapter, on an annual basis at the request of the President or in Extraordinary Chapter, even on the sole request of a member of the Staff, with at least fifteen days' notice.

The Executive Committee, chaired by the President, will decide unquestionably the remarks, the measures and also the sanctions to be applied to the Obediences participating in the A.U.M. and of the individual Brothers or Sisters to whom the debit procedure has been opened, after having listened to the reasons and after the due and impartial investigative activities.

The decision on the remarks, the measures and the sanctions to be applied must be unanimous or, in the second vote, supported by two thirds of the members of the Chapter.

In case of failure to reach the quorum, the Chapter will be updated at another session, with an interval of at least thirty days.

ART. 6

By virtue of the mutual aid agreements, mutual recognition and fraternal collaboration, the Sovereign Grand Commanders and the Grand Masters, as well as the Dignitaries signatories of the Confederate Act, undertake to consult each other in the event that Dignitaries, Brothers and Sisters intend to abandon their Obedience of belonging to join a similar Masonry Obedience, with which intercourse relations of reciprocity and fraternity exist.

They will be able to conserve signs, rank and functions if the reasons given in their application will be object of nullity to the transit by the Grand Dignitaries of the Obedience of belonging. In case of non-approval of the authorization, they may resign from their first reference Obedience but can not be accepted in the Obedience to which they have asked for.

They will keep vestments, signs and diplomas but will not be able to wear them, show them and wear them in public occasions and meetings.

ART. 7

The granting of the nulla osta to transit in other Masonry Obedience is considered an essential condition for continuing in the cursus honorum with the new Obedience in which it will be accepted.

In the event of comeback, Dignitaries, Brothers and Sisters who intend to return to the ranks of the Obedience of origin, may appeal to the Sov. G. C. or Grand Master who, in an ad hoc Chapter, will be able to readmit them, having heard them apologize, in the degree and in the inferior functions covered, until repentance will be considered concluded.

ART. 8

Every Dignitary, Brother or Sister participating to the twinned obedience and bound by a pact of fraternal subsidiarity is bound to a appropriate behavior to the prestige of the Masonic institution. In case of non-compliance, negligence, inadequate or inappropriate disciplinary behavior, the censure regarding the individual cases will be applied to them, to be foreseen with specific separate regulations.

ART. 9

The sanctions applicable to Brothers and Sisters by the Executive Committee in the Chapter of Discipline for non-compliance during common events or deemed harmful to the prestige of Confederate Obedience, will be gradual and start from oral reprimand, continue with fixed-term suspension, suspension in time indeterminate, until expulsion for serious and repeated defaults, and / or behaviors damaging the prestige and image of the Masonry Institution. The sanctions will be applied and communicated by the Executive Committee to Parliament by joint decree of the Sov. Grand Comm. and Grand Masters of Confederate Obedience.

ART. 10

The Sovereign Grand Commanders, the Grand Masters and the Dignitaries of the Confederate Obedience may propose any modification to this Protocol, in the interest of the growth of the respective Obediences and of the Confederation.

Any proposal, modification or integration will be accepted unanimously by the Parliamentary Assembly, given the importance of this act.

Failing this, the Parliament' Meeting will proceed to vote and the motions will be deemed approved or rejected by a majority of two thirds of those entitled to vote.

ART. 11

Each Obedience will contribute to the general expenses necessary for the functioning of the Confederation's structures, paying a fee to be established by January 30 of each year of social activity in a special fund that will remain available to the President and the Treasurer appointed by the same for the management of joint activities.

The accounting report will be presented by December 31st of the year to the Parliament for examination and approval by unanimity or by a two-thirds majority of the Assembly, in the event of a subsequent vote.

For the President and members of Parliament or the Executive Committee responsible for special, useful and necessary activities for the Confederation, only the reimbursement of expenses incurred and certified will be provided.

ART. 12

Each Confederate Obedience will take care of the organization of the General Assembly which, every year, will serve to track a draw up a balance sheet of the activities carried out and will dictate the future guidelines for the greater growth of the Alliance in general and of single Obediences in particular, together with the President, that will examine every official seat proposal and decide unquestionably on the matter, after the opportune consultations with the Executive Committee.

ART. 13

By signing this act, the obedience members reiterate their commitment to carry out Masonic activities for the improvement of civil society and the human spirit, refusing, from now on, the pursuit of material, economic and financial benefits, placing themselves in the tradition masonry root, and in respect with the principles of freedom, brotherhood and equality between peoples.

Art. 14

Every obedience is autonomous and, with adhesion to the Universal Masonic Alliance, it will not lose its individuality and independence, since the confederation today constituted has as its ultimate goal the universal brotherhood and common lines of action, for the affirmation of the sacred principles, of free masonry of freedom, brotherhood and equality among peoples.
